SHAKESPEARE EVENING – APRIL 2016 400th anniversary of the death of William Shakespeare

The first ten entries to the Shakespeare evening held in the club house on Saturday, 23 April were lucky enough to win masks which were part of a flag unfurling ceremony, that was named an iconic 'Mask Moment', at celebrations of his birth in Stratford-upon-Avon.

The Mayor of Stratford-upon-Avon Town and District Councils commissioned a local artist to paint a startlingly lifelike portrait of the Bard, based on the first folio. This was made into a facemask and they handed it out to over 10,000 participants in the Birthday Parade, as well as to spectators. At the given moment, everyone was asked to don their mask so wherever you looked in the town of the Bard's birthplace and final resting place, you saw the face of William Shakespeare.

And evening full of the linnet's wings.


I will arise and go now, for always night and day
