Henri Postema – Broadacres

In a century on this planet, Henri Postema has earned the right to say it like it is. For this forthright centenarian, his hundredth is just another birthday, despite very few people in the world achieving triple figures. He laughs, "It's more interesting for other people than for me! I'm the 'victim' here!" Considering he only had to give up golf three months ago, he's played a great round – that's for sure.

While he still makes a point of exercising regularly, he doesn't believe there's any great secret to his longevity. But he does concede it's probably down to good genes. "All my family died in their 80s or 90s. Ask my parents. They made me this old – I don't know what it is," he confesses.

Henri came to South Africa from the Netherlands 65 years ago, his brother, Wim, having already relocated. As youngsters, Wim and Henri were both keen sportsmen, so they loved the idea of being able to play sports – especially hockey and tennis – all year long, thanks to the sunny South African weather. Back home in the Netherlands they'd been hamstrung by the cold, grey European winters.

Henri moved to Evergreen Broadacres nearly four years ago, after the death of his wife, Riet. The couple have a son, Pieter, who lives in Cape Town, and their daughters, Maryke and Madeleine, are in Johannesburg. He says life at Evergreen has treated him well. "It's been fantastic here – unexpectedly good. I have a good friend in Craig Stacey and I call him my 'bodyguard'! The two of us talk a lot about politics and sport... especially rugby."

Two days before our interview, Western Province had beaten Henri's team, the Sharks, in the Currie Cup final in Durban. Henri laments the loss, but he shrugs it off – that's sport for you.

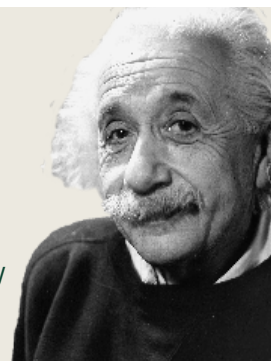

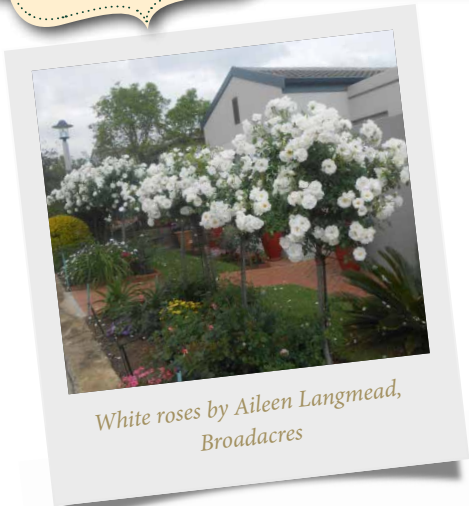

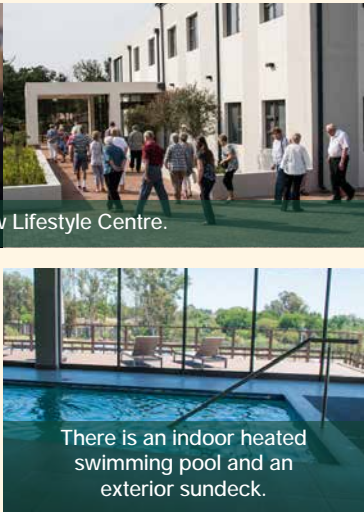


FABULOUSLY FLORA FINAL ENTRIES
