


#### CITY WARNS OF MORE STRINGENT WATER RESTRICTIONS

Water usage in Cape Town has dropped to 507-million litres a day, a notable 35-million litres lower than the previous week's spike of 542-million litres.



The City has urged all water users to save more to help break through the 500-million litre barrier. Despite the recent rain, Environmental Affairs MEC Anton Bredell, has reiterated a call on citizens to continue saving water.

The City of Cape Town's Deputy Mayor, Alderman Ian Neilson, thanked Capetonians on Monday for striving to reach the savings but revealed that dam levels had declined by 0,9% to 20%.

"This is the highest rate seen over the past few weeks and is due to a large release of water from the Berg River Dam via the Berg River to the Misverstand Dam by the National Department of Water and Sanitation. This was done in an effort to ensure uninterrupted water supply to West Coast municipalities, including Saldanha Bay. These municipalities abstract water from Misverstand Dam which had become critically low in recent weeks," said Neilson.

"We need to get down to the required 450-million litres of collective daily water usage, or 50 litres per person per day, to stretch the available water supplies," he said.

It is important to note that even though it has been raining, locals must continue to use their allocated water quota of 50 litres per day and save, since it is still uncertain how much rain will fall this winter.

Neilson warned of more stringent water restrictions if Cape Town does not manage to bring down consumption to 450-million litres a day.

"Our consumption is being closely monitored by the National Department of Water and Sanitation who are responsible for enforcement of water abstraction restrictions from the large dams comprising the Western Cape Water Supply System – the system which also supplies Cape Town.

If we are not able to bring our consumption down to the required 450-million litres a day, we could face even more stringent restrictions in the new hydrological year," he said.

### COMMENCEMENT OF CONSTRUCTION ON BARN ROAD & STARKE ROAD

Please note that the on-site project managers, Gerhard Dreyer assisted by Willem Roux, have been appointed by Evergreen Property Investments (EPI) to oversee the construction of both the apartments on Starke Road and the houses on Barn Road, where the site office is located. BL Williams Construction, a well-known company, has been appointed for both projects.

**Houses:** Practical completion has been achieved for the civil works component of this extension and setting out of the thirteen houses has started. Construction has commenced. The deadline for the houses to be handed back to EPI is set for the end of November 2018.

**Apartments:** The apartment site has been handed over to a demolition contractor, Ross Demolition, who has commenced with stripping and demolition. It is envisaged that the demolition will be completed by 21 May 2018. The site will be handed over to BL Williams Construction and practical completion is programmed for 30 April 2019.

We apologise for any inconvenience caused during this expansion phase and can assure you that EPI will make every effort to minimise the impact of construction on the existing village.
