

KEEP SAVING WATER!

Capetonians are urged to keep saving water. The combined total level of the dams is 56.9% of storage capacity. The average water consumption by Capetonians last week was 505 million litres a day – 55 million litres more than the target of 450 million litres a day set by the City of Cape Town.

The City warned that rainfall was difficult to predict with any confidence and urged Capetonians to carry on with their "amazing water-saving efforts to build a buffer for the summer months ahead"

The authorities will decide in early October, once the rainy season has ended, whether the severe Level 6B water restrictions in Cape Town will be relaxed, and if so, to what extent.

CITY OF CAPE TOWN CHANGES ELECTRICITY TARIFF & COST

The City of Cape Town has changed the electricity tariff structure and costs.

Effective 01 July, a new *Fixed Home User Tariff* of R150 per month has been introduced, irrespective of the electricity consumption. The Domestic Tariff has been reduced by 25 c/kWh for the first 600 units.

To ensure that households pay their share of these fixed costs irrespective of how much electricity they consume, the City aims to recover these costs through a fixed monthly service charge rather than as a component of a c/KWh charge.
