

WATER SAVING INITIATIVES STILL REQUIRED

Cape Town dams have managed to hang onto the 76% mark despite a lack of rain in the last few weeks. However, Capetonians are still being urged to use water sparingly as experts predict an especially dry Western Cape summer season. "While locals can breathe a brief sigh of relief, having pushed the dreaded Day Zero back to beyond 2020 through fierce water saving initiatives, other inland regions are not as fortunate" says Anton Bredell, the minister of Local Government, Environmental Affairs and Development Planning.

Bredell outlined further water conscious projects aimed at securing the province's most precious seasonal resource. Other major options being considered for increasing water supply in the Western Cape include: the Berg River-Voëlvlei augmentation scheme which amounts to diverting surplus winter water into Voëlvlei Dam; the development of the Aquifer projects in the City of Cape Town; Wastewater treatment on a macro scale in all municipalities; and Desalination.



The City of Cape Town reduced restrictions from Level 6B to Level 5, with dams having reached almost 76% capacity. The city is asking residents to use no more than 70 litres per person per day, up from the previous 50litre limit. The municipality says its decision to relax restrictions on consumers was based on signs of water conservation, rising dam levels. as well as assessments and consultations with water users and municipalities.

Bredell maintained that the province's water crisis, although in remission, would not vanish despite good seasonal rainfall. More needs to be done in the province to retain water and increase the efficiency of supply. "Our water challenges are not going to go away, instead they will potentially only increase in years to come. This is why we need to see continued progress on planned water augmentation projects from national government, which has the constitutional mandate for bulk water supply," he said.
