**Swimming pool chemicals** 


Contrary to popular belief, the toads are not poisonous to humans

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1937 Alfa Romeo 8C 2900B Touring Spider

By the late '30s, Alfa Romeo was well established as one of Europe's top performance marques, having enjoyed a huge amount of racing success over the years. From these myriad victories, Alfa developed a series of road cars that have gained legendary status amongst collectors, including the "immortal" 8C 2900. Sporting an advanced, tech-laden chassis, a powerful eight-cylinder engine, and impressive coachwork, RM Sotheby's calls the 2900 "the ultimate Italian sports car of its generation."

Understood to be the very first built on 8C 2900B underpinnings, this example was displayed at the 1937 Paris Auto Salon. It can be distinguished from the later cars by the more steeply raked radiator and the horns built into the front fenders. Shown again at the early 1938 Berlin Motor Show, chassis 412020 also starred in the sales brochure. The car is believed to have remained in Germany and was spotted by a British soldier shortly after the War. A decade later it was acquired by an American sergeant and it eventually made its way to the United States in 1960.

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#### THE DAMHUIS OF MELKBOSSTRAND

Located on Beach Road, the Damhuis (Afrikaans for "Dam House") is one of the oldest surviving buildings in South Africa. Built around 1785 by Christiaan Brand, a whaler and early settler, the structure was originally used as a 'visschuur' or fish shed. It served as a place where fish were cleaned, salted and dried and included a separate boathouse used for storing nets and fishing vessels.

Constructed using traditional materials of the time - cow manure, sand, hay and whale bones, the Damhuis reflects the pragmatic building techniques of early Cape settlers. Some sections of the original structure remain unplastered today, exposing the historic fabric of the walls and offering a rate glimpse into 18th-century craftsmanship.

The Damhuis got its name from a freshwater spring that created a dam in front of the building. Although the dam has long since been covered by the development of Beach Road, the spring still flows on the property, preserving a physical link to its past.

The site also holds significance in the context of the Battle of Blaauwberg in 1806. During the conflict, the Brand family were forced to evacuate as military forces passed through the area. The house was damaged and looted, and Christiaan Brand later submitted a formal claim for the losses incurred.

In the years that followed, the Damhuis was used as a private residence. In 2009, it was restored and converted into a restaurant, which now includes various dining areas with names such as the Fishermen's Tent, Die Voorhuijs and Die Stampkroeg. It offers traditional South African cuisine in a setting that maintains the building's original character.





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The Brazilian skydiver Luigi Cani executed one of the most important jumps of his life in the Amazon.

On this occasion, the holder of the world record for the smallest parachute jump in the world, took more than 100 million seeds from 27 species of trees native to the local biome, to a remote deforested area in the heart of the Amazon region.

When Luigi got within 6,500 feet of the deforested area, he plunged at 300 km/h,, reached the seed box in free fall and released the seeds at the correct height to ensure precise and even distribution.

The seeds collected for the project have a germination rate of over 95% and do not require human intervention to germinate, so in a few years we will see the fruits of this unprecedented action.







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#### THE STORY OF MOOIMEISIESDFONTEIN

Mooimeisiesfontein is a historical farm located in the Eastern Cape. It is most notably associated with Piet Retief, a Voortrekker leader who owned the property from 1814-1836.

Retief built a substantial house on the farm, featuring yellowwood floors and a slate roof. The house was later restored around 1974. During his time on the property, he planted an orchard and vines, but the farm's main focus was livestock farming.

By 1829, Retief had already subdivided and sold a portion of Mooimeisiesfontein. In 1836 when the Retief family left on the Great Trek to the north, the remaining section of the farm was sold.

After passing through several private owners, the farm was acquired in 1910 by a group from Riebeeck East led by Dr. Hanekom on behalf of the Dutch Reformed Church. The property was then handed over to the State with the intention that it serve as a living monument to Piet Retief and be used for the upliftment of impoverished Afrikaaner children.

The original house was repurposed as an orphanage, and a new building complex was added in 1947, adjacent to the old homestead. The orphanage remained in operation until it was closed in 1978.
