Your ResCom met yesterday and have asked that the following be drawn to your attention....

- 1. **BEAUTY OF THE VILLAGE.** The CoJ water restrictions are, of course, essential until we get some decent rains. As a direct result the kerbside water sprinklers have had to be switched off. As the beauty of the village is a pride and joy of all, we earnestly request you to water your kerbside garden in accordance with the CoJ water restrictions. If each of us do our little bit we will maintain the beauty until the real rains come as expected in November and we can get back to a normal life..
- 2. WATER IN DAMS & STREAMS. Now that the wetland grasses have been trimmed there will be temptation to venture into these areas. Please be cautious and take special care NOT to do so as we are concerned that as the water has been stagnant for a considerable time we need to be careful until the rains come and clear the potentially polluted water from the property.
- **3. EXITING THE VILLAGE.** Frederick Road is being used more and more (especially by the local speedsters). We are in the process of asking CoJ to apply some traffic calming to it. However we must all take extra care when leaving the village. In the near future there will be a STOP sign at the road entrance and a designated lane applied to the road.
