DEAR RESIDENTS

As Christmas trees spread their sparkling boughs in every Evergreen village, so I am reminded that life is laden with hope when we discard the meaningless and embrace the values which bring joy to the spirit of giving.

The American Clergyman Roy L Smith (born 1887) was blessed with a wonderful clarity of mind: he said "He who has not Christmas in his heart will never find it under a tree." To all of us who share life in a country divided by its history, it is a timely reminder of the attitudes and values that spread light in dark places. We believe that the Evergreen Lifestyle is one that is both positive and generous.

2016 has been a good year for Evergreen. In February the 47 new 3-bedroomed homes at Broadacres were released to the market, taking the village up to 130 units. 31 of these have been sold to date in a very tough residential market.

In April this year Arthur Case returned to Evergreen after an absence of two years and assumed the position of CEO. In July the new Healthcare Centre with its 32 bed frail care unit was completed at Muizenberg and is now operational. By early December the final 38 apartments in the north wing at Muizenberg were handed over and are available for sale. This represents the completion of construction at Evergreen Muizenberg - something our residents celebrated (along with the sounds of silence) with delight and relief at a roof wetting ceremony at the Village on 12 December.

In October, construction commenced on the new Broadacres 4000m² Lifestyle Centre with its healthcare centre and 32 bed frail care unit. In October we also commenced with civils construction at the Evergreen Noordhoek site. This wonderful new village will be launched in the New Year.

I'd like to thank Cobus Bedeker and the Evergreen Property Development team for their tireless efforts in the development of our Evergreen villages: and to thank each and every one of you for weathering the dust, din and disruptions with great forbearance and fortitude.

Your spirit is valued by all at Evergreen. As is your friendship and humour: I'll leave it to Arthur Case to paint a picture of what Santa has in his stocking for Evergreen in the year ahead.

The Evergreen Management Team is hoping that Santa's stocking includes safety belts for our office chairs, given that the year ahead will be characterised by markedly accelerated growth, along with the strengthening of our value propositions in our established villages. As a result, 2017 promises to be even busier for our fast – maturing business; but like any business that has survived the rigours of its establishment; we are stronger, wiser and better prepared to take on the next phase of our brand journey.

As Derek said, our responsibility at Evergreen is to live up to our pledges, and in doing so, we place great reliance upon our village management and residents: after all, travelling through life together is far more worthwhile when we can share both the joys and the burdens.

The brilliantly named 18th Century Scottish author and reformer, Samuel Smiles achieved overnight celebrity on publishing his masterpiece, 'Self Help, with Illustrations of Character and Conduct'. In it, he wrote: 'Hope is like the sun, which, as we journey toward it, casts the shadow of our

burden behind us.' In light of what lies ahead, I am thankful that – over the past eight years – we have laid the foundations and assembled a team that is as capable as it is focused.

Plans have been submitted for the construction of an additional 13 new homes and 22 apartments at Bergvliet, as well as a new Lifestyle Centre with healthcare facilities. The additional homes and apartments will assist with levy economics.

We have secured the funding to launch Evergreen Noordhoek early in the New Year. 350 units will be built on a beautiful piece of land, with views of the Atlantic Ocean and Chapmans Peak. The village will have a Lifestyle and Healthcare Centre and significant private open space.

We have concluded an agreement that will see 600 Evergreen units developed within the beautiful Val de Vie polo estate in the shadows of four mountain ranges between Paarl and Franschhoek. A number of other new locations are being evaluated for new villages, which we will announce in the New Year. In addition, the Evergreen management team are working on a number of exciting new innovations which will strengthen the business in the coming year.

2017 promises to be both challenging and rewarding. I would like to wish all of you a blessed Christmas and a prosperous New Year, along with love, light and peace for 2017.




AGE HAS NO RESTRICTION FOR EVERGREEN'S OLDEST RESIDENTS
