We have a new resident who we would like to say hello to:




If you happen to pass the old Gym building and see people walking around with big triangular wooden contraptions, do not worry. It is Sandy de Villiers and her Art class setting up shop.

^{&#}x27;No, we're just happy that they screen out the folks who would leave their best friends behind.'


