MANDELA DAY - ANNUAL POVERTY RELIEF CHARITY DRIVE

For the last three years, Sue Jackson and Jean Spur organised a charity drive to celebrate Mandela Day. As this is Mandela’s 100th birthday, it seems even more important not to let this tradition fall away and to, in our own small way, mark this great man’s life and achievements. Mandela was seen as a man of great forgiveness, humanity and ideology. Most of us were probably lucky enough to experience the time he touched the lives of all South Africans and made his mark throughout the world.

This drive involves collecting dry and non-perishable goods to be donated to a local charity. Items for collection may include rice, sugar, tea, maize meal, tinned fish, peanut butter, cooking oil, beans (dried or tinned), powdered or long-life milk and soya mince. Other items such as Sunlight soap, toilet soap and toothpaste are also welcome.

As we did last year, we would like to hand over our collected goods to All Saints Church, Richards Road, who arrange for the distribution through their Outreach Programme. Heather Mutch has agreed to arrange the delivery to the church.
