JOHANNESBURG - Health Minister Zweli Mkhize announced on Friday that South Africa has recorded its first COVID-19 related deaths, and that the number of cases increased to 1,000.

In compliance with the national lockdown, Evergreen Broadacres will be implementing the following measures:

ACCESS TO THE VILLAGE: The main gate will be closed and access will have to be approved by Village Management who will only accommodate emergencies.

SELF-QUARANTINE: All residents are requested to stay at home and self-quarantine – residents will be confined to the village. The lockdown will affect everyone. No one will be allowed to leave the village for the 21 days unless under strictly controlled circumstances, including seeking medical care, buying food, medicine or other supplies.

FRIENDS & FAMILY: Friends and family will not be allowed into the Village, even if they say they are just going to drop something off at your house and will simply leave it outside your gate. We will accept the item and deliver it to you. We will deny them access.

SOCIAL CONTACT: Residents are encouraged to stay at home and keep social contact to a minimum. **You are not allowed to go for walks or walk your dog in the Village.** If you do go out of the village for buying medication or food, please keep your distance to 2m between people.

CLUBHOUSE CLOSED: The Clubhouse is officially closed to ALL residents. The bistro area is being used as a work station where deliveries are dropped off and where essential staff get screened. This also means that you will not be allowed to come to the clubhouse to use the Library, Gym or watch TV.

FOOD DELIVERY: Reef will carry on supplying one take away meal item per day that will be delivered to your house or apartment. No meals can be consumed in the Bistro / Life Style Centre.. Notices have been sent out and more will follow.

HEALTHCARE SERVICES: Should you need to see the nurse or need to have your BP taken, you can call us and a nurse with proper protective gear will be sent to your house as soon as possible.

ESSENTIAL SERVICES: NO domestic workers/gardeners will be allowed access to the Village. Only essential workers will be allowed into the village.

REFUSE COLLECTION: We are not certain whether the City of Johannesburg will continue to collect refuse. We shall endeavour to continue bin collection on Mondays, with our limited staff. We shall keep you updated should anything change. Apartments can place their refuse in the passage on Monday morning and we will remove / alternatively you can take your refuse to the collection point by the entrance to the Village.

It is business *UNUSUAL* and new measures will be implemented in the days to come. We shall keep you informed by circulars or on the newly created Whatsapp group. The committed Evergreen team remain on the frontline of this pandemic, trying to keep you safe. For further information about the imminent lockdown please use the following link:
