With us now making noise at 5 pm, the rest of the neighbours go out at 8 pm, and this causes a prolonged period of noise.

I know that this outing every day is the highlight of a lot of folk's days as they get to see other people. We need to please be mindful that this does not become the social hour where people go into the streets and socialise. This is the exact reason why such strict lockdown rules were enforced. Please ensure that at any time you are keeping a 2-meter distance from any other person and that you stay on your side walk or property. Please do not go into the road and socialise or walk over to your neighbour's side walk.

The SAPS have been to a number of Estates and complexes in our area and my concern is that these neighbouring residents will report the socialising that they are "seeing from their balconies" and we will get a visit from the SAPS.

We certainly don't want this happening in our Village and therefore I appeal to you to please stick to the guidelines.
