The sense of community and responsibility in our Village has been absolutely tremendous under these trying times. Times that would have been a lot easier if we had a hug from a friend or family member.

We realise that a lot of resident's gardens are in need of a bit of tender love and care and we are happy to have Silas, Jabulani and Piet back at work this week. They have been around only on Mondays for the past 6 weeks to remove dustbins and to tend to refuse only.

Now that they are back, you are able to book them for assistance around your houses and gardens. They will wear a mask and you will be asked to keep a 2-meter distance when telling them what you would like to have done. We have two working lawn mowers in the village at the moment that they can use as well should you need them. Please call reception to book them. The only day they will not be available will be a Monday when they do bins in the village.

We have originally asked that you don't walk around the dam and in the usual dog trail sections due to the grass not being cut and we were worried that residents might trip or dogs might go missing in the bushes. We have had time to cut this grass now and feel it is safe for residents to now walk in these areas.

We have had a lot of residents make use of the library service by requesting books to be delivered by our duty managers. Thola has been especially good at this and she is on a night shift on Sunday so she asked if residents can get their book returns done in the next two days, she will have the entire Sunday night to sort these and put them back on the shelves so they are available for the next readers. Please just phone reception and we will come and collect them or feel free to drop them at the clubhouse.
