FACILITIES AVAILABLE

Dear residents,

This is a reminder that all the following facilities are available in and around the clubhouse:

1. Gym equipment: we are concerned at the very low utilization of this equipment that is costing us R9 000/ month! We checked the record for a recent 30 day period: 1 resident visited it 10 times; another 2 residents visited it 4 times each and a third resident visited it once! So, folks please use that wonderful equipment! You do need to pre-book, and only 1 resident is allowed on the equipment at a time, but as you can see there's hardly ever anybody there so the chances are good that if arrive you'll be able to book and gain immediate access!
2. Gym floor: the space is available, but must be pre-booked.
3. Swimming pool: the utilization is also low! Over the same 30 day period only 4 residents used it logging 34 visits between the 4 of them. You also have to pre-book but as for the gym the chances are good that if you arrive on the spur of the moment you'll be able to get in. Also only 1 resident is allowed in at a time.
4. Table tennis: the table is available in the gym and may be used at any time that the gym floor is available. As for other gym activities it must be pre-booked. Bats and balls are available from reception. Please carefully follow the table opening and closing instructions.
5. Petanque or Boule: now available and being played near the big blue gum trees at 3.00 pm every Thursday afternoon! Felicity and Henning Brandt are the organizers and if you're interested call them on Ext. 1122.
6. Croquet: the croquet mallets, gates and balls are also available from reception. All you have to do is to get together a party to play and you can have an enjoyable session on the lawn in front of the clubhouse. It would be good if somebody who knows and loves the game would put up their hand to organize croquet as the Brandts have done for Petanque.
7. Dartboard: We are investigating the availability of a moveable dartboard stand.
