FROM CHAIRMAN HENNIE

January 2021. Dear fellow residents.

Here we are at the begining of a bright new year. We were all hoping that COVID would be on its way out, a fading bad memory and that our lives would be returning to something resembling the old normal. But that was not to be: COVID is alive and well and has invaded the lives of a few more in our community. And very few of them actually know where they contracted the virus! That's the scary part: it could be anywhere so be very, very careful!

Our traditional Burns Night celebrations had to be cancelled. Looming are our St Valentine's day, St Patrick's Day and St George's day etc. celebrations. Management will inform us nearer the time in each case whether a celebration will be permitted.

At our RAC held way back in September you raised many issues that required answers from ELV management. We had hoped that we'd get and debate those answers at our AGM, but that has been indefinitely postponed so you haven't had the answers. There have been numerous exchanges between your ResCom and management since then.

We've received clear and acceptable answers to some of the issues but not to others as per the following (management's response in red):

- Repainting and general maintenance of the exteriors of all Phase 1 and 2 houses: Work to commence in June 2021.
- Fiber to Phase 1 and 2 houses: The fibre project has provided some challenges for various reasons beyond our control. This project is an expressed priority for implementation post the COVID19 pandemic. We want further clarity on what is meant by "...post the COVID19 pandemic."
- Recreation room and Waterhole bar counter: Work to commence in recreation room in February; bar counter already moved.
- Garbage disposal and recycling area: Not a high priority item and feedback will be given when the project has been relooked at to accommodate what ever will be built on the new piece of land that was acquired in July 2020. We have requested a discussion on this.
- · Generic and Addendum A house rules: We are awaiting further input from management.
- Repairs to fences: Most of the fence painting was completed last year and we have replaced most of phase 1 fences. The remainder will be done as an ongoing project over the next two years as originally the entire job was a 3 year ongoing project.
- Bistro: Service has resumed and is very good. Still outstanding is a formal announcement on whether it will continue under Reef or be brought in-house, and if so when..
- · Garden service: This has been resumed.
- Levy increase: Our request for a levy increase holiday has been turned-down. Turned down in order to ensure that next year's levy increase can be kept in line and prevent it from being much higher than CPI.
- Care center: Still outstanding is a formal announcement on whether it will continue under UH or be brought in-house, and if so when.
- LED Information Board at the entrance: This project will not proceed as there are other, very much lower cost options for improving communications.
- Loerie lane: It has ben changed back to one-way traffic. Management is still assessing the impact and will re look at this at the end of January as per the given timeline.
- Apartment's climate control: The design of the apartment buildings is appropriate, well considered and approved by authorities. Extensive monitoring and temperature loggings have been done in the apartments. Portable air conditioners have been installed into the show units and this has shown the biggest impact on reducing the temperatures in the apartments. A decision has been made on the way forward and this will be discussed with each individual apartment holder. ResCom understood that the outcome would be shared with all residents and has requested a further discussion.

And the car is British (well...Scottish), a 1902 Albion!!! (ask Jim Green all about their lorries)




A Mr Charles Glidden and his wife did this world trip which was about as adventurous as flying to the Moon in 1902.

Charles Jasper Glidden's motor car, a British Napier, parked near a horse-drawn coach in Singapore.


Photograph taken during the first round-the-world car tour in 1902 by Glidden, the most ardent early advocate of the automobile as reliable form of transport.
