- I believe she is insured for the house contents but obviously it is unsure, at this stage, to know how much this will cover
- Evergreen asked Sally if she wished to come back into the village, and offered her accommodation, but she has decided to stay with her daughter and family for at least the next three months but she needs to think about whether she would come back sooner and she might very well do this.
- Evergreen is going to rebuild her home and she has the option to return there or possibly consider moving into a similar home in the village
- Sally was told about the donation from the Spurr family and was thrilled and overwhelmed. It has been decided that Evergreen will remove the furniture from Jean's home in mid-August, when it is handed over, and Evergreen will store this furniture, etc until Sally is in a position to establish what she needs.
- Everyone in the village is very anxious to donate or help Sally. We have started a special fund, using our ResCom bank account, FNB - account No 62847606037, and people may donate, with a reference, eg Sally B and their unit number, for us to keep track and for Sally, and with possibly my help, to respond. - Maybe in a month or so, I suggest we hold a special presentation for her when we hand over the donation, and maybe a gift or two.
