The month began on a most promising note and even though this all but disappeared up to reporting date, we still enjoyed the highest October rainfall since 2012.

There are also encouraging forecasts of more to come by the end of the month.

Total dam levels across the country, although down on last month's report, continue to show an appreciable improvement over the same week last year (79% vs 63%), although the Eastern Cape continues to experience difficulties.

Nonetheless the drive to conserve water remains a national imperative. Remember we remain subject to water use restrictions in Johannesburg.




