EASTER SUNDAY

Easter is the single most important holy day throughout Christianity. It celebrates the resurrection of Jesus Christ – a central belief for Christians worldwide and the focal point of their faith. Religious scholars believe the vent occurred three days after the Romans crucified Jesus in roughly 30AD. Christians therefore derive hope that they too will experience a resurrection in heaven.

While those of the Christian faith observe Easter by participating in religious rituals, vigils, and going to Church, there are many non-religious traditions on Easter for children. The most common tradition is dying Easter eggs, including a lot of fun activities such as agg rolling and egg hunts. Flying kites and games like leapfrog are also popular, as well as games associated with the Easter bunny.

Chocolate and other candy, especially bunny – or egg-shaped ones are widely consumed. Pastel colours like Pink, baby blue, and lilac are associated with this day and are seen everywhere on clothing, dyed eggs and at events.
