	 Load shedding – going forward a gas oven has been suggested and that it is arranged on a lease basis to facilitate full time cooking facilities without interruption. This seems to be stuck between Fedics and Evergreen Management neither of whose budgets have provided for this. EF – asked about the various Evergreen's – whether there is any overall management to address the hot food issue in the kitchens of all the villages with the exception of Noordhoek who have generator power to all areas in load shedding. EF suggested that if all the Evergreens go to a gas company as a whole – the gas could be provided at a very reasonable rate SW suggested that EF meet with DD to discuss the issue of the option to use gas HT mentioned that nothing with regard to this will happen in the immediate future but it is under discussion EF said that Amdec/Evergreen should be negotiating a gas contract and HT explained that this is possibly already happening – to find a suitable service provider 	EFDD

Request for savoury items along with the pasties and cakes for those who do not have a sweet tooth. SW requested that pies and or sausage rolls be available to purchase by resident to heat up in their own homes. Soups are now available and KW said that they are very nice HT said that the flavour of the food overall has been very well received and enjoyed by many of the residents HT to take it up with Fedics- the queries. HT keeps a track of the invoices and notices that the usage of the Bistro is increasing monthly KW - the printing of the A 'la Carte menu is to be done by Fedics but it is taking much longer than is necessary - they are responsible to create the menu, print it and distribute it SW & HT will take it up with Fedics (Chantelle and Nikki) Father's Day menu for 18th June under discussion Next resident's braai will be on 20th June - 33 attended last time.
