Rod grew up in Johannesburg and attended Kind Edwards School. He had the title of Professor of Cinematography conferred upon him by the Cape Technicon in 2005. He has been Director of Photography on more than sixty international feature films, winning international awards for much of his work.

For over twenty years, he and his wife, Melanie, ran a film production company, Rod Stewart Productions (PTY) Ltd., in Johannesburg, making commercials, documentaries, programmes for television and training films. In 2001, Rod transferred to Cape Town as General Manager of Movie Camera Company, and then to Cinegate, also as Managing Director, to improve these companies' positions in the cinematographic market.

He retired from Cinegate to lecture at film schools, universities, Technikons, and Orms. He has continued to freelance in the industry since then. In 2023 he ran a course in Lusaka, for Multichoice, for post-graduate students from Southern and Central Africa. Rod also handles international lighting workshops, run by Kodak, the purpose of which has been to introduce video cameramen from the African continent to film and film technology, in Lusaka, Lagos, as well as Johannesburg and Cape Town. Rod is past president of both the South African Film and Television Technicians' Association (SAFTTA), and the South African Society of Cinematographers (SASC). For five years Rod was Chairman of the Consultative Committee (a body advising the Department of Home Affairs on the granting of international work permits for people in the entertainment industry).
