This year we are again calling upon our residents to be involved in this wonderful charity event.

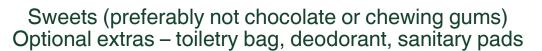
How it works:



By Any Other Name by Jodi Picoult

An inspiring, sentimental women's fiction blended with historical fiction, powerful feminism, and diverse vibes, intercepting the stories of two women who are not connected by DNA but share the same fate. As two storytellers/aspiring writers try to make their voices heard in a man's competitive universe, they are forced to write under male pseudonyms to have their works produced. Overall, this is a fresh, thought-provoking, well-researched, and heartfelt novel. Definitely a must-read for the author's devoted fans like me and any reader who is looking for inspirational women's fiction!

Cutting For Stone by Abraham Verghese

An enthralling family saga of Africa and America, doctors and patients, exile and home. Marion and Shiva Stone are twin brothers born of a secret union between a beautiful Indian nun and a brash British surgeon at a mission hospital in Addis Ababa. Orphaned by their mother's death and their father's disappearance, the twins come of age as Ethiopia hovers on the brink of revolution. Their passion for the same woman will tear them apart and force Marion, fresh out of medical school, to flee his homeland. An unforgettable journey into one man's remarkable life, and an epic story about the power, intimacy, and curious beauty of the work of healing others.

The Glass Maker by Tracy Chevalier

Venice, 1486. Across the lagoon lies Murano. Time flows differently here – like the glass the island's maestros spend their lives learning to handle.

Women are not meant to work with glass, but Orsola Rosso flouts convention to save her family from ruin. She works in secret, knowing her creations must be perfect to be accepted by men. But perfection may take a lifetime. Skipping through the centuries, we follow Orsola as she hones her craft through war and plague, tragedy and triumph, love and loss.

Tracy Chevalier is a master of her own craft, and The Glassmaker is vivid, inventive and spellbinding.

Mrs Winterbottom Takes a Gap Year by Joanna Nell

Husband and wife GPs Alan and Heather Winterbottom have worked side by side in their medical practice for over forty years and have now retired. Heather quickly realises that their ideas of how to spend retirement are very different. Heather has long dreamt of exploring the Greek islands and assumed history loving Alan would love it too. However, Alan dreams of stopping in one spot, relaxing in the garden, growing his own vegetables and becoming self-sufficient. Heather decides to follow her dream, leave Alan in his garden, and take a 'gap' year before settling into retirement.

Mrs Winterbottom Takes a Gap Year is heartwarming, funny at times and moving at other times. Lessons learned, friendships forged and a happy ever after.

Lethal White by Robert Galbraith

When Billy, a troubled young man, comes to private eye Cormoran Strike's office to ask for his help investigating a crime he thinks he witnessed as a child, Strike is left deeply unsettled. While Billy is obviously mentally distressed, and cannot remember many concrete details, there is something sincere about him and his story. Trying to get to the bottom of Billy's story, Strike and Robin Ellacott — once his assistant, now a partner in the agency — set off on a twisting trail that leads them through the backstreets of London, into a secretive inner sanctum within Parliament, and to a beautiful but sinister manor house deep in the countryside.

And during this labyrinthine investigation,
The most epic Robert Galbraith novel yet, Lethal White is
both a gripping mystery and a page-turning next
instalment in the ongoing story of Cormoran Strike and
Robin Ellacott.


